
Uniform or Dress Code Requirements

Work Schedule Details

Employees receive their schedule from their department's scheduling manager. Schedules will be posted online where it can be accessed and reviewed by employees. A minimum of 35 hours per week must be work, weekends, nights and holiday shifts are required and schedules may be adjusted during holiday weekends. Any additional time off must be requested for approval with a minimum of 2 weeks notice, if there are ever any shift delays or cancelations due to inclement weather employees will be notified via email prior to their shift. After Labor Day Casino Pier operates on a reduced scheduled (weekends only) until Columbus Day allowing for students to travel during the week.

Meals Included

Employees receive a discounted employee menu at the Pier Grill and Dockside restaurants at work. If employees decide to eat outside of the employee menu they will receive a 25% discount on their order.

Paycheck Deductions (in addition to taxes)

Employees staying in our housing will have their rent reduced from their weekly paychecks, the total amount of rent will be discussed and decided by the housing manager.

Games Attendant

15 Positions \$14.50 /hour 35 hours /week

Position Description

Game Attendants are responsible for working inside of an arcade or booth, promoting games to guests, collecting/dispensing tickets, prizes and money sales, assisting guests as needed with questions and troubleshooting game issues. Your employer may ask you to perform other duties related to your job type. If you have questions or concerns about this, please contact InterExchange.

Additional Description

Step on up! As a game employee you are the life of the boardwalk! As a games attendant you will be working one of our classic boardwalk games attracting guests to your game and assuring they have an unforgettable experience while playing to win the grand prize.

Requirements:

A games employee will be in fast paced one on one communication and interaction with customers. An employee must be able to project out to potential customers and attract attention to your game. Basic math skills are required for currency exchanges

The employee must give an explanation and description of how each game is played.

Every employee will be responsible for maintaining and replenishing merchandise in midway games and they must maintain cleanliness of the game area and merchandise prizes.

Physical Demands:

- An employee will occasionally be receiving incoming stock, Common Carrier, UPS, FEDEX unloading and distribution (20-25 LBS).
- Employees will be required to stand for long periods of time (6 8 hours).
- Specific vision abilities are required for this job and they include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception and the ability to adjust focus.
- Employees will be working indoors and outdoors and are exposed to all types of weather and, are also, exposed to loud noise throughout the day.

Lifeguard

15 Positions \$14.50 /hour 35 hours /week

Position Description

Lifeguards are responsible for ensuring a safe environment for swimmers. You must be able to recognize and react properly in emergency situations. You will check and maintain specific chemical levels in the pool and operate the pool filtration system. Additional duties may include but are not limited to cleaning the pool and surrounding areas, cleaning the restrooms, removing trash and enforcing facility rules and gate control. Your employer may ask you to perform other duties related to your job type. If you have questions or concerns about this, please contact InterExchange.

Additional Description

This is NOT your beach lifeguard job! Most of our water is shallow. You don't need to be a super strong swimmer, nor do you have to run miles along the beach to train! All we ask is you like to be outdoors, like to wear hats and sunglasses, and are not afraid of being in the water! We will train you to do the rest!!! If you want to get paid to have fun, get a great tan, and make a difference in people's lives, then read on and put in your application today!!! Lifeguarding/Attendant is a fun, admirable, and memorable experience with tons of privileges and rewards. Lifeguards are among the few summer jobs where you can truly make a difference in someone else's life, as well as your own As a Lifeguard you will be responsible for Attendant responsibilities as well as Lifeguard responsibilities. This includes guest safety in pool and run out areas. You are expected to maintain a proactive scanning pattern at all times, and remain in a rescue ready position at all times.

Requirements

Shallow Certification. With this Certification you will be able to guard all areas in the park. In order to acquire this certification, you must: Swim 50 yards continuously and in a comfortable fashion. Swim down 5.5 feet, retrieve a brick and swim it to the wall.

Physical Demands

Lifeguards will be working outdoors, often in bright sun and will be exposed to hot, humid conditions, cold rainy temperatures, as well as fumes or airborne chemical particles. Employees are occasionally exposed to moving mechanical parts and vibration. The noise level is usually loud. All workers will perform physical activities that require moving one's whole body, such as lifting, balancing, climbing, and stooping or bending. These activities also require considerable use of the arms and legs. Lifeguards will be required to stand for long periods of time and may be required to sit for extended periods of time on an elevated chair. Will be required to lift, push, or carry objects weighing up to 25 pounds frequently and occasionally lift and/or move more than 100 pounds. Lifeguards may be moved between various departments as needed.
