Work Schedule Details

Participants will maintain an average of 32 hours per week once the amusement park is open. Cedar Point Amusement Park is open 7 days a week from late May until the end of August. Beginning in the month of September, the amusement park is open weekends only through October 31st with varying hours between 8 am and midnight.

Scheduled shifts vary in length from 8-hour, 10-hour, and 12-hour shifts.

Schedules will be posted on their UKG scheduling app in which they are able to request shift swaps, call off, and pick up open shifts.

Work schedules are dependent on park attendance and weather. The average work week is 5 days, 32 – 40 hours per week.

Meals Included

Associates have an Associate Bistro available to purchase discounted meals.

Paycheck Deductions (in addition to taxes)

Our affordable housing fees are deducted directly from the associate's pay and range between \$70-\$84 per week depending on which dorm they reside. All students will have 72 hours upon arrival for their orientation and first day of work and 72 hours to depart Cedar Point's associate housing after their last day of work.

Drug Testing Requirements

Cedar Point is committed to ensuring the safety of all guests and staff. Cedar Point conducts pre-employment drug tests for all safety sensitive positions such as Ride Operators or Lifeguards. All employees may be subject to a random drug screen throughout their employment regardless of the position they work.

Description

Associate housing is co-ed dormitory style housing, with 4 occupants per room. We work to fulfill roommate requests as long as we have open availability.

In order to be the best hosts and ensure the safety of our international staff, Cedar Point encourages students to live in Cedar Point's extremely affordable employee dormitories.

In addition to our 24/7 security staff, our team of RA's (resident assistants) are always available and ready to help our residents any way they can! The online StarRez portal is the hub for all Associate Life activity. Students will receive communication via email regarding next steps once they arrive.

The Associate Recreation Center (ARC) is available for all associates and residents to enjoy a wide variety of activities and amenities including a sand volleyball court, full court basketball, full size soccer field, foosball tables, pool tables, air hockey, and table tennis.

The ARC also has a lounge with large TVs, WiFi, computer lab, and many small card games. All students will have 72 hours to depart Cedar Point's associate housing after their last day of work.

House Rules

- All Associates are required to follow the policies and procedures outlined in the Cedar Point Resident Experience Handbook.
- Access to Cedar Point Associate Housing is limited to active Associates aged 18 and up. Up to two family members aged 18 and up may assist with check in, check out or medical emergencies.
- All residential buildings within Associate Housing are multiple occupancy. Each resident is provided access to one locker and dresser drawer. Please limit the amount of personal items brought on campus.
- Residency is limited to active seasonal Associates only. If your employment status with Cedar Point changes or comes to an end you are required to leave campus.
- If leaving campus for an extended amount of time, even with intent to return, residents must contact the Commons Office before leaving to avoid being marked as a Walkaway Resident. Cedar Point is not responsible for any items left on campus.
- The use of and/or possession of drugs (including cannabis), fighting, or the use of and/or storage of weapons on campus will result in immediate termination of your employment.
- Residents are permitted to have one (1) handheld can of pepper spray, which is required to be TSA approved.
- All Associates and their guests are required to follow all posted signage throughout campus buildings, common areas and parking lots.
- Graffiti and/or instruments potentially used for graffiti are strictly prohibited.
- Remote controlled cars, helicopters, drones, and other like toys are not permitted on Cedar Point property, including the Associate Housing Campus.
- Outside furniture or fixtures including, but not limited to desks, couches, dancing poles, and mattresses are not permitted within resident rooms or anywhere on the Associate Housing Campus.
- For the safety of all residents, rollerblading, skateboarding, roller-skating, scootering, and monorovers (hover boards) are not permitted on the Cedar Point Associate Housing Campus including parking lots.
- Bicycles (including E-Bikes) are to be stored in designated areas and are not permitted inside your living space or in hallways. Please be cautious while riding.
- Pets of any type are not permitted on the Associate Housing Campus, including fish. Emotional Support Animals (ESAs) are required to be registered and be given approval through Cedar Point's formal ESA application process prior to being permitted on Campus.
- As a courtesy to fellow residents, the use of personal speakers is prohibited in all indoor common areas including hallways, laundry rooms, restrooms, and showers.
- Use of your assigned room may only be used as a residential dwelling; any other use is prohibited.

Cleaning Responsibilities

Residents are expected to utilize facilities, furnishings, and equipment for their intended purpose and clean up after themselves. You are expected to keep all areas of your room clean, uncluttered, and free of odor. Associate Housing has made available general cleaning supplies such as Ecolab 14 disinfectant, vacuums, brooms, and dustpans for loan at each RA desk. All items borrowed must be returned to the desk on the same day. Free trash bags are provided at each RA desk and the Commons Office. Dumpsters are available throughout campus for room trash disposal. Please do not set items next to dumpsters, in hallways or in common areas. Residents found to be in violation of this policy may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including eviction from Associate Housing.

Laundry

Laundry is free for active Associate Housing residents. Most locations throughout the campus have an in-building laundry room. A central laundry room is also available at the Commons Office. Residents are responsible for the laundering of their bed linens, bath towels, and personal clothing items. Associate Housing does not provide laundry detergent but, a limited selection of laundry products is available for purchase in Market C.

With a valid Cedar Point ID, associates can access the Sandusky Transit System free of charge for transportation to and from the Associate Housing Campus, as well as personal use for shopping, dining, and entertainment. Plus Cedar Point's own bus will provide transportation from associate housing to the park. Since Sandusky is mostly rural and walking or bicycling can be challenging (limited sidewalks & paths are in place) our bus system is the safest mode of transportation. Position Description

Ride Operators are responsible for displaying a professional, pleasant attitude to all customers. Job duties for this position may include starting and stopping amusement park rides, assisting guests on rides, and giving safety instructions to guests. Students may be expected to work in other areas of the store as directed by management. Your employer may ask you to perform other duties related to your job type. If you have questions or concerns about this, please contact InterExchange.

Additional Description

Working as a Ride Operator means you'll ensure a safe and efficient operation of rides, while maintaining focus on the ride area and guests. You'll also...

- **Verify riders are properly seated and safety restraints are secure before every ride cycle.**
- **Operate ride control systems which may vary in terms of complexity.**
- **Memorize and deliver scripted safety announcements over a microphone.**
- **Screens riders to ensure they comply with ride requirements including proper height/weight restrictions, loose article and ride admission policy.**
- **Maintains a professional, cheerful, and hospitable disposition while engaging guests at every point of contact.**
- **Conducts pre-opening and closing checks to ensure the ride is safe, secure, and clean.**
- **Anticipates rider needs while being alert and attentive. Please note: No personal phones are allowed while on the clock! Due to safety reasons, if you are found with a phone while clocked-in and in position, this will result in immediate termination.**

***This is a high guest facing contact position. You must have above average ability to speak and understand English.**

***Must pass a mandatory pre-employment drug screen upon arrival to Cedar Point.**

May-August: Locations are open 7 days a week with varying hours between 8 am and midnight. Scheduled shifts vary in length from 8-hour, 10-hour, and 12-hour shifts. (Average 32-40 hours per week.)

Beginning September: Weekends only through October 31st with varying hours between 8 am and midnight. Shifts vary in length from 8-hour, 10-hour, and 12-hour shifts. (Average 32-50 hours per week.)

Work schedules are dependent on park attendance and weather. The average work week is 5 days, 32 – 40 hours per week. However, hours may increase later in the season (August – early September).

Our Wardrobe team will provide two uniform shirts for all positions and two pairs of shorts for most positions at no cost. Associates will be required to provide their own pants and shoes for all work locations. (Out of pocket expense of roughly \$75). Uniforms vary on work location and more information will be provided during wardrobe fitting. Most positions require a closed toe athletic shoe that is mostly white, gray, or black with no bright neon colors.

Position Description

Housekeepers are responsible for cleaning rooms, vacuuming, changing linens and towels, making beds, cleaning bathrooms, and doing laundry. This position can be physically demanding and you may be required to use chemical cleaning products. Your employer may ask you to perform other duties related to your job type. Working in a housekeeping role means you will ensure the guest checks into a clean room and give memorable service to each guest you encounter. You'll also... - Be responsible for providing a clean, healthy, attractive environment in private and public guest areas of Cedar Point Resorts. - Maintain cleanliness and safety in assigned work areas and perform all duties in compliance with Cedar Point Safety guidelines. - Restock supplies, such as shampoos, conditioners, soaps, etc. in guest rooms and storage areas. - Carry dirty linens from guest rooms to the laundry area for processing. - Use a vacuum daily to maintain floors. - Collect trash from containers, pick up trash items in hotel rooms, and public areas. - Cleaning bathrooms, which include bathtub, sink, commode, floor, tile and mirrors. - Make beds ensuring a neat, presentable appearance. *This is a low guest facing contact position. Lifeguard**9 Positions**

Position Description

Lifeguards are responsible for ensuring a safe environment for swimmers. You must be able to recognize and react properly in emergency situations. You will check and maintain specific chemical levels in the pool and operate the pool filtration system. Additional duties may include but are not limited to cleaning the pool and surrounding areas, cleaning the restrooms, removing trash and enforcing facility rules and gate control. Your employer may ask you to perform other duties related to your job type. If you have questions or concerns about this, please contact InterExchange.

You may need to help rent lockers to customers, which will include handling money. Your employer may ask you to perform other duties related to your job type. For this position you must arrive between June 15 and June 30 (start dates only) and end dates of 9/30 until October 9.

Working in Park Services, you'll play a key role in keeping our park clean and events exciting for our guests. You'll also...

- **Maintain the cleanliness of tables, pavilions, and food patios as well as around dumpsters and behind-the-scenes locations.**
 - **Empty and dispose of trash and recyclable material while maintaining clean trash containers in assigned areas.**
 - **Clean restrooms including toilets, sinks, countertops, and mirrors**
 - **Learn and comply with the safe and appropriate use of all chemicals necessary for the job.**
 - **Using tools such as a pan and broom, picker and bucket, web remover, pond skimmer, squeegee, deck brush, or clean cloth rags are used for a variety of cleaning tasks.**
 - **Follow standard operating procedures including the use of personal protective equipment in conducting all cleaning tasks.**
 - **Continues a mobile presence within assigned zone while working which may require an extensive amount of walking.**
 - **Monitors guest behavior and consults with an immediate supervisor or security as needed.**
