n lieu of bonuses, our company does reward employees for doing a great job! When employees have their evaluations , we are always eager to reward employees with raises for a job well done during the season. Every employee has the opportunity to increase their hourly rate based on above-average job performance.

Uniform or Dress Code Requirements

All employees are to report to work with an energetic and friendly attitude and should wear a smile along with some comfortable, closed-toed athletic shoes, khaki walking shorts or capris, hairstyles and makeup conservative in nature. For guys, hair should be off the collar and trimmed around ears and off face, for gals hair not covering face with conservative hair color, no piercings anywhere but on the ear and then only one earring per ear, no other piercings. Uniforms provided, one free and two at cost, plus uniform sweatshirt at cost. All requirements are also outlined in our Employee Handbook. \$60 for all uniforms mentioned.

Work Schedule Details

Schedules are done on a weekly basis and an employee is welcome to request a specific day off that can remain the same throughout the season. Hours vary with off season hours around 32 and in season hours around 50 per week. Schedule changes are made based on weather and traffic and your Manager will advise you of any schedule changes.

Meals Included

We offer 50% any menu item while the employee is ON SHIFT. 20% off any menu item in any one of the Boardwalk Family of Restaurants when the employee is OFF SHIFT. We also offer \$4 and \$5 meal tickets on the Boardwalk Main Deck that can be used in any one of our four food concessions.

Paycheck Deductions (in addition to taxes)

We deduct \$125 weekly from the paycheck for any student who is in our housing. We also deduct the onetime uniform cost of approximately \$60/65 as well as the one time bike fee of \$35 if the student would like a bike for the season. All deductions begin when the student is working full-time (34-40+ hours per week)

Description

We do our best to make housing facilities a pleasant environment for all employees. We employ over 200 individuals and house over 100 of them. Housing is a combination of dorms, apartments, and shared houses. All housing is fully furnished with utilities included, internet, and air conditioning. The kitchen includes all cooking equipment. There is a washer/dryer, cleaning supplies, and trash bags. All bedding, towels, and linens are provided for \$50.00. You will share a room and there are two people per room. Most of the housing is within walking distance to work. Bikes are also made available at a rate of \$35.00 for the whole season. There is a \$300.00 security deposit for housing due at check in with a \$200.00 refundable amount due to you at the end of the season (\$50.00/bedding package and \$50.00/end of season cleaning deducted). Upon your arrival, you will sign a housing agreement in addition to completing all of your payroll information. The 2023 housing charge is \$125.00/week & is paid through a payroll deduction.
