
In the area

Participants may use cleaning chemicals. *Speed and the ability to be able to communicate with guest to understand their needs are important. *Participants must be fun, friendly, outgoing, and helpful. *Experience working with money and in food service is helpful. *Participants will work inside in hot weather elements. *Although participants will work primarily in Food Prep and Sales, participants may be cross trained in other departments such as Housekeeping, Park Services, Reservations, Recreation, Store Sales, Park Attendant and Rentals Clerk. Duties would include processing guest reservations and registrations, cleaning guest rooms and common areas, assisting with special events and activities, selling merchandise at the gift store and grocery store, or selling boat rentals to guests. All participants may be trained as lifeguards as well. 24 hours of training is required for lifeguards. Each participant will receive American Red Cross certificate upon completion. **Participants may be eligible for \$1 per hour bonus.** Bonus will only be paid if season is successfully completed and all requirements are met according to signed employment manual. Additional Description

As a housekeeper, participants are responsible for cleaning (washing, dusting and vacuuming, tidying) bathrooms, guest rooms, and property common areas. Job duties include picking up after a guest, preparing fresh linens, making beds, dusting furniture and fixtures, washing floors, vacuuming carpeted areas, emptying trash cans, cleaning windows (usually less frequently), cleaning the bathroom, shower, sinks and toilet, keeping the guest rooms stocked with accessories, and keeping the bathrooms stocked with supplies. *Housekeepers will be using cleaning chemicals. *Participants should be hard working, efficient, outgoing, fun, friendly, and helpful. *Participants should expect to work inside and outside in all weather elements. *Although participants will work primarily in Housekeeping, participants may be cross trained in other departments such as Reservations, Recreation, Food Prep, Store Sales, Park Attendant and Rentals Clerk. Duties would include processing guest reservations and registrations, cleaning common areas, assisting with special events and activities, preparing and serving food, selling merchandise at the gift store and grocery store, or selling boat rentals to guests. Position Description

Lifeguards are responsible for ensuring a safe environment for swimmers. You must be able to recognize and react properly in emergency situations. You will check and maintain specific chemical levels in the pool and operate the pool filtration system. Additional duties may include but are not limited to cleaning the pool and surrounding areas, cleaning the restrooms, removing trash and enforcing facility rules and gate control. Your employer may ask you to perform other duties related to your job type. If you have questions or concerns about this, please contact InterExchange.

Additional Description

The lifeguard position requires participants to watch over the pool areas to ensure the guest's safety. *Must be able to fully communicate with guest to understand their needs and explain pool area rules and policies. *CPR or lifeguard experience is preferred but the employer will train all participants hired for this position. In order to complete this training, participants must be able to swim 90 meters, retrieve a brick from a depth of 1.5 meters and tread water for 2 minutes without using their arms. 24 hours of training is required for lifeguards and participants are required to sign a document that they will reimburse the business \$250 if they leave employment prior to their ending term. Each participant will receive American Red Cross certificate upon completion and 24 hours of unpaid training. *Lifeguard will work outside in the pool area in all weather elements, including full sun and rain. *Participants should be hard working, efficient, outgoing, fun, friendly, and helpful. *Although participants will work primarily in Lifeguarding, participants may be cross trained in other departments such as Housekeeping, Park Services, Reservation, Recreation, Food Prep, Store Sales, Park Attendant and Rentals Clerk. Duties would include processing guest reservations and registrations, cleaning guest rooms and common areas, assisting with special events and activities, preparing and serving food, selling merchandise at the gift store and grocery store, or selling boat rentals to guests. Participants working in Reservations/Front Desk will perform a variety of administration duties. *Answering a multi-line phone system, making reservations for incoming guests, registering guests, and answering any questions about the area and campground. Speed and patience are very important while processing all calls and registrations. *Registration duties are performed outside in a covered booth. The registration position requires participants to be walking to cars to register guests upon arrival and help them with questions or concerns. *Participants will work inside and outside in all weather elements. *Participants must be able to fully communicate with guest to understand their needs. *Experience in sales and cash handling is preferred. Participants should be hard working, efficient, and able to work well independently as well as outgoing, fun, friendly, and have a helpful personality.
